CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- Multimodal Transportation Fund Grants
 - Street Paving Project If approved by Council, the City will apply for a PennDOT Multimodal Project
 Grant for street resurfacing and ADA ramps. The total cost is projected at approximately \$4.3 million.
 The grant is for 70 percent of the total costs with a 30% City match, or approximately \$1.2 million. The
 streets that would be included in the project are named on the attached list.
 - Truck Route Project If approved by Council, the City will apply for a PennDOT Multimodal Project Grant for \$2.1 million to be used for the Truck Traffic Revitalization Project. The grant is for 70 percent of the total costs with a 30% City match. An identical DCED Grant was applied for which was not denied, but this second grant opportunity opened up with PennDOT. Mr. Sizer asked when work would begin if the grants were approved and received. Mr. Fiscus said it is typically three to four years from application of the grant until the work begins.

CITY MANAGER: Mr. Fiscus invited everyone to attend Small Business Saturday which is a day-long event and includes lighting of the Christmas Tree. Happy Thanksgiving.

CITIZENS:

Dave McLaren, 1113 Haig Street, asked Sherris Moreira about her visit with the Mayor of New Castle. He asked if they have a Downtown Development team in New Castle. Ms. Moreira said they were inquiring about Sharon's program and requested job descriptions.

Mr. McLaren asked how much the City paid for the bank building. Mr. Fiscus said the amount was approximately \$330,000.

Mr. McLaren asked who owns the properties on North Sharpsville Avenue that is the recipient of ARPA grants. Mr. Fiscus said some of the properties are owned by JCL Development. Mr. Fiscus said businesses are identified and/or contact the City to request information on the available programs.

Mr. McLaren asked about \$5,000 in ARPA funds given to the Sharon High School Park, as reported in The Herald. Mr. Fiscus said this was a misprint; \$5,000 was given to the Bike Park.

Mr. McLaren asked the location of this evening's Sharon Planning Commission meeting. Mrs. Bundrant said it was a phone-in meeting through the Teams App; information is posted on the City's webpage. At tonight's meeting, the Commission discussed funding for the Truck Traffic project, requested the GIS mapping log-in for the City, and asked if the City budgeted for a Planning Commission staff person. Mr. McLaren asked if the Planning Commission discussed the zoning of the Shenango Inn property and the proposed Dollar Store on Sharpsville Avenue. Mrs. Bundrant said this would be the responsibility of the Zoning Board.

Kim Curry, Spruce Avenue, asked if Edgewood Drive, between Cedar Avenue and Spruce, could be added to the list of streets for the Multimodal Grant project. Mr. Fiscus said it cannot be added to this list but can be identified for a possible change order or a future project.

Ms. Curry asked about the closing of the Wengler Bridge at the Freeway and if ARPA funds could be utilized for repairs. Mr. Fiscus said the bridge is a County-owned asset and was permanently closed by the County. Repairs to the bridge would likely be \$1 million. He would like the road to be permanently reconstructed rather than the use of barricades

Ms. Curry asked if there are any recreation projects planned similar to Shenango Township, such as ice rinks or pickleball courts. Mrs. Bundrant said there are no plans at this time, other than the facilities at Buhl Park. Ms. Moreira said PSU plans to put in indoor pickleball and basketball courts in the former Carine building, which will be available to the public. Mrs. Bundrant said we are always looking for recreation opportunities, which require space and funding. Ms. Curry said there is space available at the Wengler School property. Mrs. Bundrant said the property is owned by the School.

Ms. Curry asked for an update on the ARPA funds to be distributed to businesses. Mr. Fiscus said the application period for larger grants closed on April 29th. Grants for new business attraction remains open. The total amount was \$800,000 and more than half has been drawn down. Awarding of grants is temporarily on hold until January. More details will be available at the December Workshop. In addition, there are infrastructure needs within the City and approximately \$4 million is set aside for these needs; we are awaiting results of engineering studies.

Ms. Curry asked about HOME Grants for Housing Rehab and if the City can apply for the grant for next year. Mr. Fiscus said he will research the grant.

MRS. BUNDRANT: Mrs. Bundrant echoed Mr. Fiscus regarding Small Business Saturday, which will begin at 9:00 AM on November 26th with a ribbon cutting at the roundabout.
