- Dave McLaren, 1113 Haig Street; Mr. McLaren asked if Council has set the 2024 meeting schedule and times. Mrs. Bundrant said it will be addressed at the reorganization meeting.
- Mr. McLaren asked about parking in downtown. He there are three less parking spots on State Street near the
 former Willson's building as lines are now painted there. Mrs. Bundrant said the lines were painted in accordance
 with PennDOT regulations since it is a state route. Mr. Fiscus said the lines were painted by the Street
 Department following City Ordinances and PennDOT regulations. It was done correctly and was most likely
 wrong in the past.
- Aiden Martin, 344 Russell Street; Mr. Martin asked, "what is an important issue to the people of our community". Mrs. Bundrant said the number one issue when she was first elected to Council was blight; a lot of people were upset their neighborhoods were not cleaned up. We feel like we have made a lot of progress in the last few years. Mr. Martin asked what is being done about it. Mrs. Bundrant said the City's Code Department is amazing and they organize clean ups of alleyways and neighborhoods where it is especially bad. They work with the Beautification Commission and volunteers, and they all get together and clean up, mow lawns, and other things to make the neighborhoods safer and more beautiful Mr. Martin asked, "how can young people help"? Mrs. Bundrant said young people can help by staying active; you can join a commission, you can volunteer. We have worknights every Monday at 5:00 PM while the weather is nice. We encourage young kids to get involved. West Hill students were getting involved and once you are in the High School sometimes the teams get involved. You can start on your own. On your way home by picking up trash with some gloves on and putting in a bag and doing your own neighborhood.
